No confidence yet, after a tumultuous time

A lack of clarity or certainty

A fundamental question following the proposed closure of manufacturing sites and the industry and Government response is, looking forward, do we have confidence the market will deliver fair, affordable electricity to support our exporters, manufacturers, and businesses. And the answer is No. Not Yet.

On the supply or generation side, there is no doubt changes to consenting processes will help build new generation. A new regime for offshore wind generation will hopefully facilitate faster development. But we are not building the right mix of generation, and we're not building it where its most needed – and there is nothing in the system that will change that. There is a role for the System Operator to analyse what generation we need to ensure a balanced generation portfolio, and to use the market to secure the necessary investment, underpinned by underwrites, Government bonds, or other instruments to give investors confidence long-term investments will not be undermined by policy or regulatory changes over time. Without something like that, issues with highly intermittent supply and lack of firming and peaking will get worse over time, not better.

But changes to the supply side of the market will not address concerns MEUG and others have with the market itself.

If you believe wholesale prices are reflective of scarcity then it is hard to explain why, since the Government put the threat of virtual separation of the gentailers firmly on the table, the wholesale price has been nearly \$0 MW/h. We are still short of gas, despite recent rain, the hydro lakes are still well below what they usually are for this time of year, and we are facing the real possibility of shortages next year.

There is no clarity on what the Government's promised look at competition will involve, or even when it will start (or finish).

The Taskforce announced last week does not itself have any decision-making powers and its work arguably does not involve substantive market reform, other than improving the likelihood commercial and industrial users (and independent retailers) will be able to get a better-priced hedge. A hedge price better than we've seen over the last few months is likely still too expensive relative to what businesses in other countries we compete with have to pay.

And even that presumes you have confidence in the Electricity Authority to deliver reform, given their track record over the last six years and pace of delivery. It will be interesting to compare the speed the Commerce Commission works at, with that of the Authority. We hope the Authority is up to the challenge.
