Low residual review

- 1. This is a brief cross-submission from the Major Electricity Users' Group (MEUG) on Transpower's consultation paper *System Operator co-ordination of low residual situations*¹ published on 20 November 2024.
- 2. MEUG members have been consulted on the approach to this cross-submission. This cross-submission does not contain any confidential information and can be published on the Transpower's website unaltered. Members may lodge separate cross-submissions.

Summary of points

- 3. Following our review of the consultation paper and the six submissions, MEUG has the following comments:
 - We support maintaining the current Low Residual threshold of 200 MW.
 - We support a regular two-yearly review cycle of the threshold, to ensure it reflects any material changes in the electricity market.
 - We do not believe that it is necessary to rename the CANs to an Industry Advice Notice but appreciate how including the term "industry" within any new name could help clarify who the notices are primarily targeted at.
 - We do not support a 24-hour delay in publishing the CANs on the website, and agree with the points set out in Powerco and Contact's submissions for this question.
 - Given the volume of CANs issued within a year, we consider that it can be hard for large consumers to ascertain what actions may be required from them. We would support more direct information where it is directed at large consumers.
